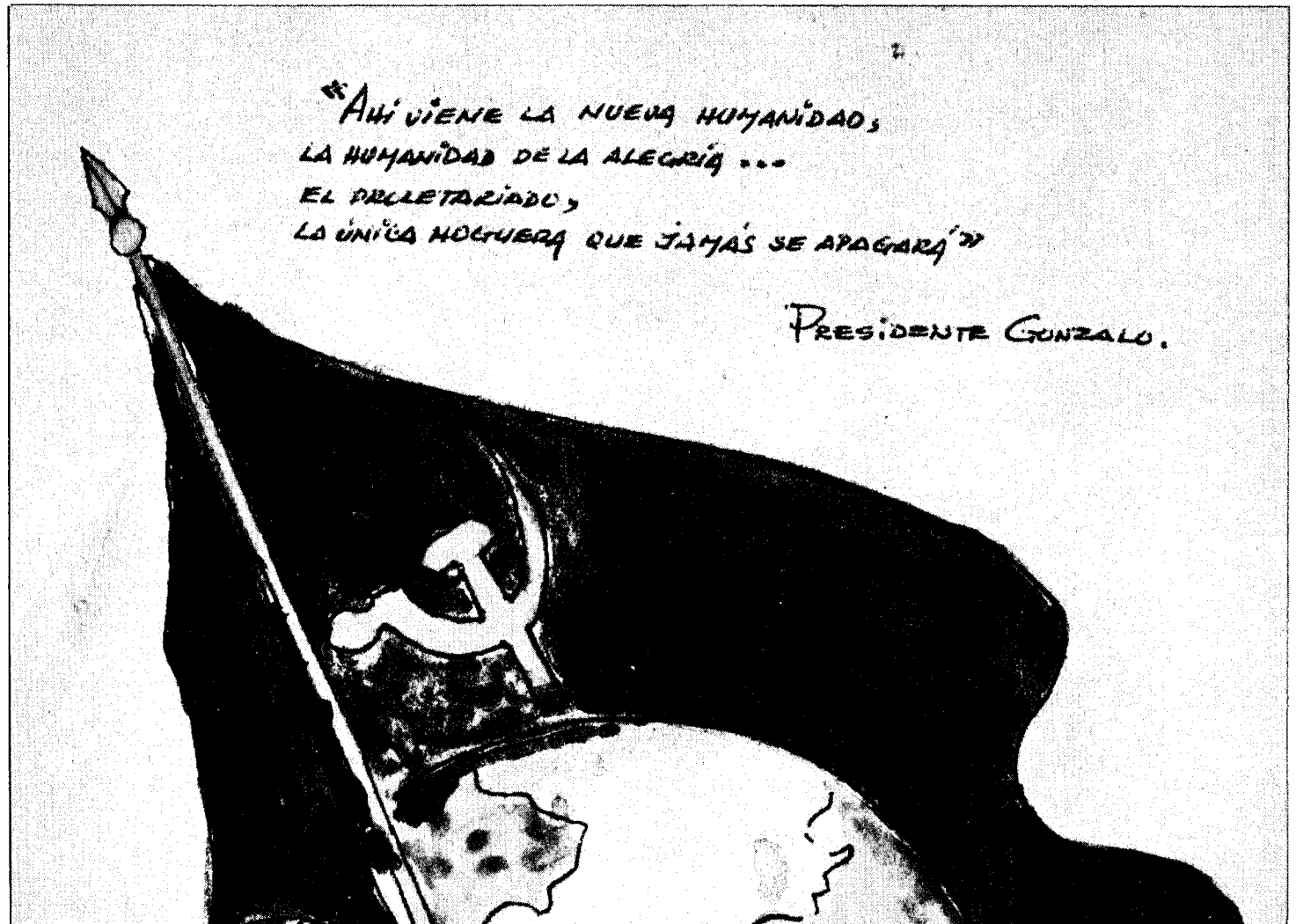


Revolutionary Art from Peru's Prisons

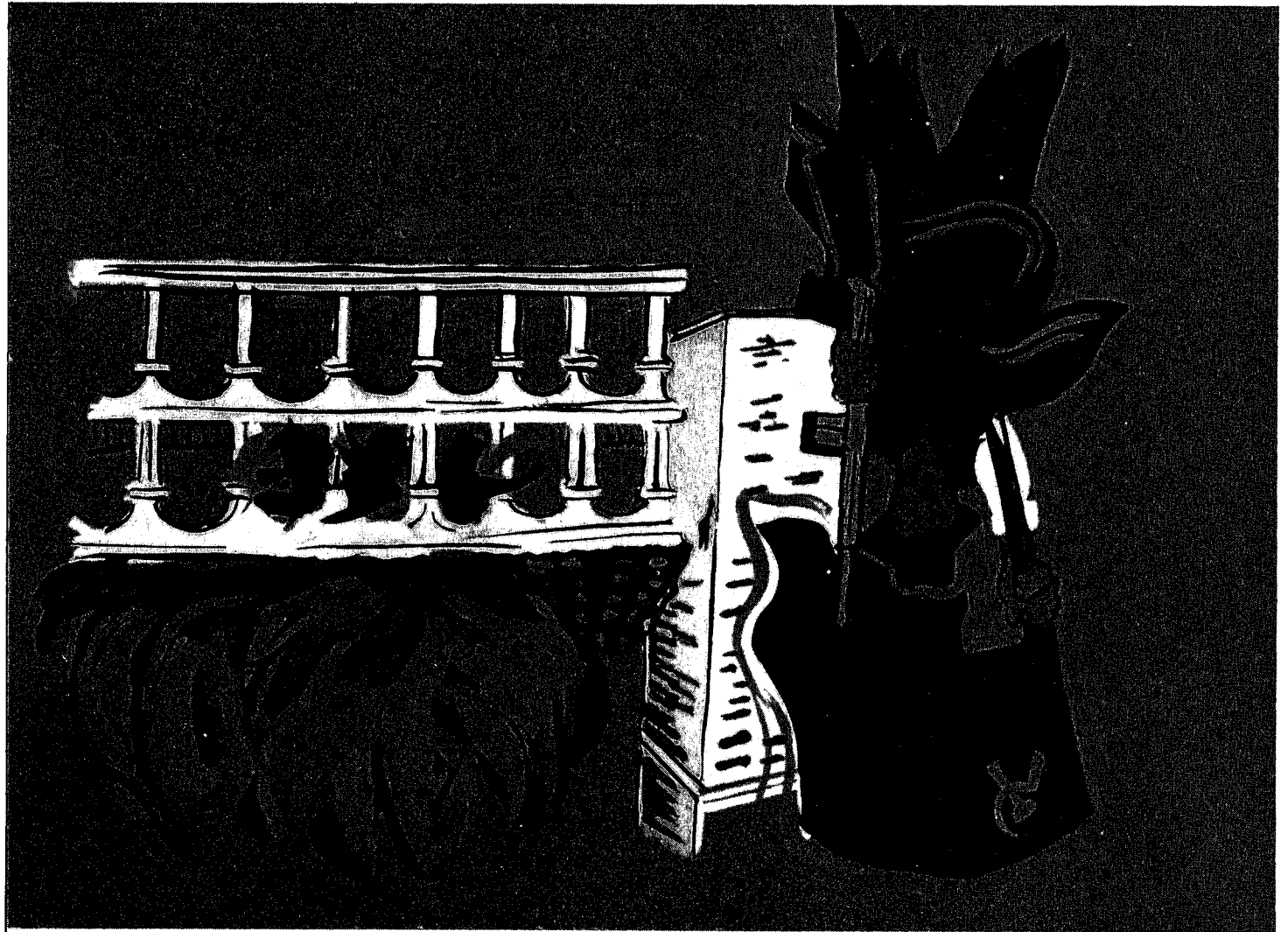
A selection from an exhibition of several dozen paintings done in Peru's prisons displayed in many countries as part of the Worldwide Campaign to Support the People's War in Peru.
